In his career (1960-1977) he played 775 games, scored 45 goals, 198 assists for 243 points.

Career

Played in the London Minor system and went to the OHA St Catharines Teepees (Black Hawks) in 1960 (at 16 years old). After Junior he played 3 years - moving between the AHL Buffalo Bisons and the NHL Chicago Black Hawks - moving up to the Blackhawks fulltime in the latter part of the 1964 season

Played fulltime for the Black Hawks from 1965-1975, was then traded to the New York Rangers in 1975 and played 2 seasons. Retired due to back injuries.

Additional Details

Was the first London Born hockey player to play in the National Hockey League

Was a stay at home defenceman - earning the nick name " *Chairman of the Boards*" for his devastating hip checks along the boards.

During his career Chicago made it to the Stanley Cup Finals 3 times 1965, 1971 and 1973 losing all 3 to the Montreal Canadiens

Was inducted into the London Sports Hall of Fame in 2011.
